- County FPO Meeting the County Fire Prevention Officers Association did not meet in September. Their next scheduled meeting is on October 17th.
- Codes & Ordinances Update The County fire agencies are currently working to update their local fire code ordinances to ensure that they are consistent with the minimum requirements found in the 2022 California Building Standards Code. The new codes go into effect on or around January 1, 2023. Additional details on the proposed changes to the local fire codes to occur in October. The California Board of Forestry is still working to establish updated fire safe regulations found within California Code of Regulations Title 14. No update to this regulation effort has been provided as of the last report in August. These regulatory changes do not impact the Zone 9 (Ember Resistant Zone) regulations currently under development by the Office of the State Fire Marshal.
- Wildfire Legislative Update AB 179 was signed by the Governor in September 2022. This bill authorizes an additional \$100 million in the current year State budget for wildfire prevention efforts. Included in this bill is an authorization of \$13 million to CAL OES for its Home Hardening Assistance Program. SB 896 (Wildfires: Defensible Space Grant Programs for Local Governments) was signed by the Governor in September. This bill will require local governments, including the County and local fire districts, to report defensible space and home hardening assessments within a Statewide reporting system to be eligible for certain statewide grants.
- EDC Vegetation Management/Defensible Space Program The County Fire Chiefs
 Association and Fire Prevention Officers Association are working with the County Wildfire
 Preparedness and Resilience Office staff, CAL FIRE, U.S. Forest Service and other local
 government partners to examine potential changes to the County's existing Vegetation
 Management/Defensible Space ordinance.

- Mosquito Fire 76,000 acres, 49% contained, solid line around fire rain helped but fuels dry back out even after rain.
